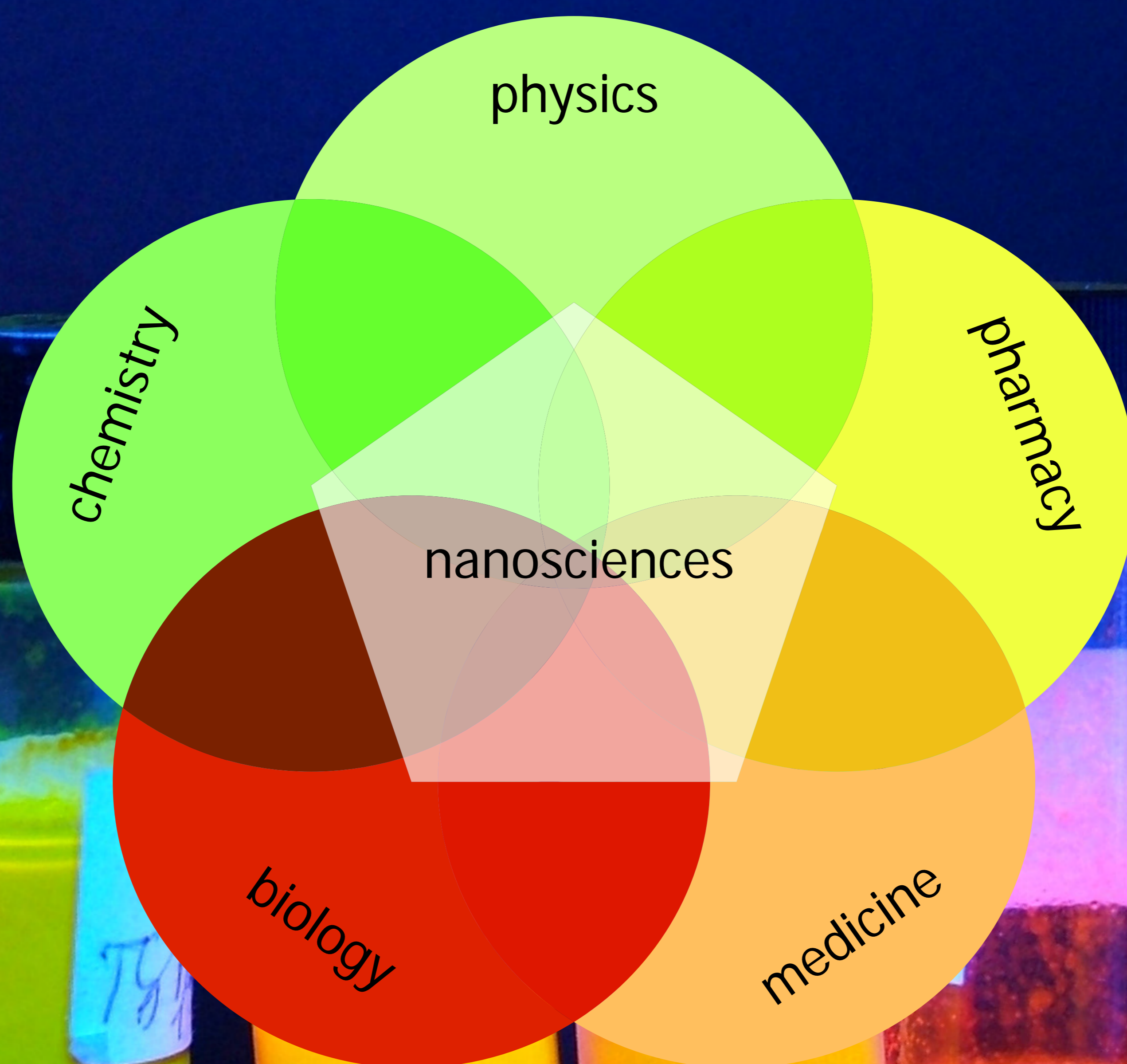

The Center for NanoScience (CeNS) was founded in 1998 at the Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität (LMU) in Munich as one of the first nanoscience networks world-wide. Today, CeNS crosslinks the work of about 80 senior and junior scientists and almost 200 PhD and Diploma students. The CeNS members share their extended interdisciplinary knowledge of physics, chemistry, biology, medicine and pharmacy to promote progress in nanosciences and nano-bio-sciences.



Research Cooperation

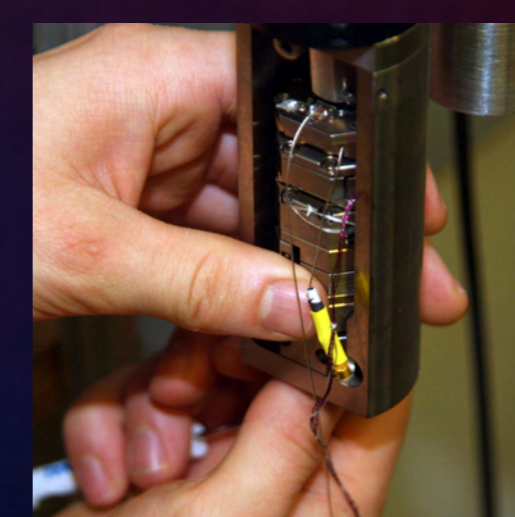
