General comments about transportation in Venice:

Given the particular geographic situation of Venice, please expect every trip to take more time than you think!!

The transportation inside of Venice works by boat or you just walk. The local public transportation by boat is called **VAPORETTO**. There are many different lines going to different places in Venice, so please refer to the following information to find the correct line.

Lines No. 1 and 82 follow the Canal Grande, which is a beautiful, but slower option than the other lines which don't go through Venice, but around the old town and are faster. You can buy cheaper tickets (**conference cards**) for € 10,50 for the first day, for € 15,00 for two days, € 19,50 for three days, € 3,00 for each day thereafter.

How to reach the conference location VIU:

From San Marco to San Servolo:

The public boat to San Servolo leaves from the "Riva degli Schiavoni" (boat landing "San Zaccaria") close to the Piazza San Marco. The stop is in front of the Londra Palace Hotel and you have to take boats **n**° **20**.

From the Train Station (Ferrovia) Santa Lucia or Piazzale Roma to San Servolo

There are several choices from Piazzale Roma to San Servolo. You must take the **n°1**, **n°41**, **n°51**, **n°61** (only from Piazzale Roma) or **n°82** boat, direction "Lido", and get off at the **San Zaccaria** boat stop. At San Zaccaria you must change to line **n°20**. Both lines leave from in front of the Londra Palace Hotel.

From Marco Polo Airport (Venice) to San Servolo:

Take the shuttle bus **ATVO** (blue bus) or **ACTV** (orange bus No. 5) to **Piazzale Roma** (takes about 20 min) or the **ALILAGUNA** service to **San Zaccaria** (takes about 1h30) and then continue as explained above.
